This year POC invited the ECDEC Preschool families to garden with us. Adults chat and bond as they plant, till, hoe, weed, water, and lovingly grow their plants. Master Gardener, Raj, taught us about the benefits of planting together the 3 sisters, corn, beans, and squash, and identifying new seedlings from the weeds! The families expressed so much gratitude for their time at the garden, and a desire to continue gardening at ROOTS for years to come!

Activities such as Music and Movement, Storytime and Crafts, and Science Experiments focus on gardening, insects, and nature. Children learn about helpful garden bugs, make nature collages, sing and dance with the ukulele, and test the acidity of the soil. Harper Promise volunteers and ICompete staff members enrich the time with bubbles, jump ropes, bug hunting, and laugh-out-loud funny games of Duck, Duck, Goose.
