


News You Can Use Summer 2023

POC is incredibly proud of Liza Gutierrez, Director of Immigrant Programs who graduated today as a Colibri fellow from the Immigrant Justice Leadership Academy! Liza worked hard over the last 9 months to become partially accredited with the Department of Justice. This achievement will allow POC to refine and improve legal services for immigration relief. Way to go, Liza!





- POC served **35,773** individuals.
- ICompete served 2,275 individuals and outreached to 3,600 individuals while canvassing and accompanying the All Saints Food Pantry Mobile Unit to local apartment complexes in Palatine.
- The Violence Prevention Program served 5,793 individuals including 64 teens and 250 family members. The program started in April 2022.
- Family Learning Lab served 734 individuals.

- ROLE served 694 women (includes parent mentors, bilingual liaisons).
- 365 volunteers participated in programming and fundraising
- The Clothing Closet served 622 people.
- Workshops, Outreach, and Case Management Services under the Access to Justice and IL Welcoming Center Grants served 6,634 individuals.
- POC assisted the All Saints Food Pantry in serving 16,754 people.



Success Story! Celebrating New USA Citizen, Rosa Perez!

Rosa began her journey with POC 17 years ago when she came to the Community Resource Center for Harper Classes. She was pregnant then and, after having her first child, would bring little Stephanie to childcare as she worked on perfecting her English literacy skills. Rosa joined ROLE and, while going to school, began volunteering with the Artists Market and filling other needs with POC programs and services.

Over the years, both of Rosa's children have participated in ICompete activities, and we have enjoyed watching them grow and become involved in their community, just like their mom! When Rose was ready to return to work, POC helped her secure a job with CCSD15 with a schedule that allowed her to volunteer still and be home with her children. Last month, after hours of preparation on her own and with ROLE mentors, Rosa passed her citizen test! We now see Rosa helping in our community closet with some of her extra time on her hands-she is a true example of ROLE, and we are honored and proud to be a part of her remarkable life!
